## Blast from the Past

#### CONCQUER YOUR FEAR OF WRITING AND PRESENTING SPEECHES

I joined Toastmasters to improve my ability to listen, to concur the fear of speaking in front of people and to think quickly on my feet during a conversation.

Some of the problems I have experienced difficulties with in writing, practicing and presenting speeches are as follows:

- 1. Nervousness It took me almost nine months before I presented my "Ice Breaker" speech. I felt like I really couldn't stand at the lectern and speak about myself. I felt foolish and lacked confidence to write and present a speech about me. Through the guidance of my "Mentor" it was possible for me to write a seven-minute speech about myself and present it. Through all my fear, shaking hands, trouble breathing and my heart jumping out of my chest, I was able to present my speech and begin my growth process as a Toastmaster.
  - a. What I have learned since I joined Toastmasters is that everyone, even seasoned speakers, are nervous each time they do a speech.
  - To combat the nerves I
     do thorough research
     on my topic and make
     sure it meets the
     guidelines for that
     project.
  - c. I write speeches about subjects I am passionate about. That makes it easier to remember the content, forget the nervousness and breeze by the mistakes if there are any.

- d. I rehearse over and over again until I know the opening, the main points and close without much thought of delivery.
- e. On the day of the speech, I arrive early and test any equipment I may be using. I also stand at the lectern and get a feel for the room. This helps put me at ease.
- f. I do deep breathing exercises before I present, which slows my heart rate down, relaxes me and makes me more at ease.
- Content I found that it is sometimes difficult to think of topics that will interest the audience. I chose topics that are of interest to me and hopefully others. Your audience wants to take the information and turn it into reality.

I ask myself these questions in writing my speeches:

- a. Does my material share information that others would grow from?
- b. Is the content clear and easy to understand?
- c. Are there technical terms or terminology that the audience might not understand?
- d. Does the audience connect with my speech?
- e. Does the speech allow me to show my personality? To share what I have learned/experienced in life?
- f. Does everything flow in a logical manner?
- g. Does every point, illustration, joke, prop return you to the purpose of the speech?
- h. Does the topic energize the audience and urge them to take action?

I hope the above information is helpful to you in preparing and presenting your speeches.
